Since April 2011, the School of Business and Economics has been accredited as one of sixteen German Business Schools by the Association of Advanced Collegiate Schools of Business.



Campus

The facilities of the University of Münster are spread all over the city. A [wide range of classes](#) at the School of Business and Economics is regularly taught in English at both the Bachelor's and Master's level. All courses available for exchange students are part of our regular course offering. A full-time course load for our students is defined as 30 ECTS.

English and/or German should be at least Level B2 according to CEFR, the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.



Nomination and Application Procedure

Housing

Exchange students [can apply for a room](#) in a student hall of residence operated by the Studierendenwerk Münster (Student Support Services). Unfortunately, not all students can be accommodated here. However, there are several alternatives: The Episcopalian Student Support Services (Bischöfliche Studierendenwerk) also [operates five halls](#) of residence in the city of Münster and many exchange students also find accommodation on the private housing market.

Living Expenses

Living expenses for students in Münster run to approx. 850-900€ per month. Please calculate with approx. 300-450€ for a room, 110€ for health insurance, 50-100€ for equipment student will need for his/her studies, and about 250-300€ for food and leisure activities per month.

Visa Requirements

Citizens of the EU, EEA and Switzerland do not require a visa. Students from other countries must apply for a national visa at the German embassy in their home country. The residence permit costs appr. 110€.

Health Insurance

Health insurance is mandatory for everybody in Germany. Without a valid health insurance in Germany, student cannot get enrolled.

Tuition Fees

At the University of Münster, all students must pay a semester contribution fee for each semester (currently 352,67€ per semester).

Services

- Semester ticket that allows students to use all local public transportation in Germany (and to some foreign cities near the German border) for free. It does not include the use of long-distance trains and first-class coaches.
