




MAP

PEDD YOUNG SCHOLAR AWARD

The Young Scholar Award is endowed with 500€ and is presented to the best paper authored by one or multiple young scholars (pre- or post-doc, no tenured faculty) all under the age of 35 as of Sep 25, 2023. Papers co-authored with tenured colleagues/supervisors or senior researchers older than 35 are not eligible.

The newly established Paper Selection Committee also served as the jury for the 2024 PEDD Young Scholar Award. The jury evaluated all eligible submissions based on the degree of originality, innovation, methodological rigor and contribution to the field. Each jury member independently chose their top contender. The PEDD Young Scholar Award is awarded to the paper that received the overall highest number of points.

The jury members were delighted to see the high scientific quality of the contenders. Their work covers a wide range of topics and methods, and address relevant research questions in the current literature. The winner of the 2024 PEDD Young Scholar Award will be announced in the Opening Session on Thursday, February 22, 2024.

Leonard Wantchekon: “State Capacity and Institutional Experimentation”

Leonard Wantchekon is Professor of Politics and International Affairs at Princeton University and Associated Faculty in Economics. He is also a fellow of the Econometric Society and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. After completing his undergraduate training and Master's degree at Laval University and the University of British Columbia, respectively, Professor Wantchekon earned a PhD from Northwestern University in 1995. Subsequently, he held positions at New York University and Yale University, before moving to Princeton in 2015. Professor Wantchekon's research focuses on the political and historical roots of economic development in Africa, and on political institutions and governance. His work has been published in leading journals in Economics and Political Science, including *Quarterly Journal of Economics*, *American Political Science Review*, *American Economic Journal: Applied Economics* and *Journal of Politics*. In addition to serving as editorial board member and reviewer for various top journals, Professor Wantchekon is also committed to training the next generation of African economists. He is the founder and president of the African School of Economics, which offers state-of-the-art economic education to aspiring researchers and professionals.

Nicola Fuchs-Schündeln: “On the Endogeneity of Economic and Political Preferences”

Nicola Fuchs-Schündeln is Professor of Macroeconomics and Development at Goethe University Frankfurt. She is also a Research Fellow with the EEA, IZA, CEPR and CESifo. Professor Fuchs-Schündeln completed her undergraduate degree at the University of Cologne and moved to the United States for her graduate education. She earned her PhD in Economics from Yale University in 2004. From 2004 to 2009, she was Assistant Professor at Harvard University, before she moved to Frankfurt in 2009. Professor Fuchs-Schündeln’s research addresses questions on consumption and labor supply in private households, welfare effects of economic regimes and tax systems, as well as the formation of preferences. Her work has been published in all top Economics journals, including *American Economic Review*, *Quarterly Journal of Economics* and *Review of Economic Studies*. Professor Fuchs-Schündeln has received numerous awards for her scholarly achievement, including the prestigious Gossen Award from the German Economic Association and an honorary doctorate from Otto von Guericke University Magdeburg.
